Authors must include the following information in his/her submission letter:

□ Please add the following sentence at the end of your letter:

"This paper has not been copyrighted, or is not in the process of being copyrighted, by any other professional, technical, or trade organization."

2. Word and Word-Equivalent Count:

Use the following guidelines to arrive at the total word or word-equivalent count:

- □ Title has a maximum of 75 characters
- □ ABSTRACT has a maximum of 160 words. (Do not include mathematical expressions, bullet points, references, or footnotes in an abstract. Abstract shall be comprised of one paragraph. Start the abstract with the word "ABSTRACT:" using bold, underlined, and an all-caps No. 11 Arial font). The abstract itself shall precede the title and shall be placed on the same line.
- KEYWORDS: Maximum 10. (Keywords shall be used for indexing and other information-retrieval purposes. Keywords shall precede the abstract starting with the word "KEYWORDS:" using bold, underlined, and an all-caps No. 11 Arial font)
- □ Author's Biographical Information: Maximum 80 words per author
- □ Tables: Approximately 350 words (for small tables, count each as 190 words). Make sure that all columns in tables have headings.
- Figures: Large figures (max. size 6.5"x4") equal 250 words; small figures (max. size 3.5"x2.5") are equal to 70 words. Must have figures and images be at least 300 dpi and sent separately as well as incorporated into the manuscript.
- Manuscript maintained at 11,000 words or word-equivalent?
- □ Have you counted each equation as 50 words?

□ Research Significance (*Technical Papers Only*): 90 words (Provide a paragraph or two identifying the significance of the reported work to the post-tensioning industry)

3. Margins and Formatting:

- □ Manuscripts typed using double-spacing in 12 point Times New Roman font. (This should include abstract, references, and figure titles. <u>IMPORTANT NOTE</u>: Handwritten manuscripts, single-spaced, or manuscripts written with small font size will not be accepted for review).
- □ Paper size used is 8½ x 11 in.
- □ Margins (top, bottom, and sides) are 1 in.
- Manuscript typed on one side of the paper only
- □ There is no paragraph indentation throughout the manuscript.

4. Miscellaneous Considerations:

- Authors' names listed as follows: First Name, Middle Initial, Last Name
- Summary and Conclusions included
- Acknowledgements
- □ *References* section: This section shall be assigned the last section number. For example:

9.0 REFERNCES

- □ *Notations section*, if any? (Provide a list of notations used in the manuscript. List mathematical symbols alphabetically in a section preceding the *References*. Use capital letters preceding lower case letters, e.g., A, a, B, b. The Roman alphabet comes first, followed by the Greek alphabet. Do not intermingle alphabets).
- □ Number all figures (or tables) consecutively. When referring to a figure, use the abbreviation "Fig. 3" for example, as opposed to "Figure 3". Use "Figs. 4 and 5" In place of "Figures 4 and 5".
- □ Table and Figure captions included? Only the words "Fig." And "Table" in all figure and table captions shall be bold as given by the following examples (note case):
